

**Minutes of the September 25, 2018, meeting
of the Journalism Association of Community Colleges Board of Directors**

House called the meeting to order at 5 p.m. She sought approval of the Aug. 28 minutes. M- Rico-Sanchez Sylvia, S-Duffy. Approved.

Duffy asked for insight on student directors' duties at the regional conferences. Rico-Sanchez said she would work with Duffy and Smith on their roles at SoCal.

Kaplan-Biegel said she continued to seek student hosts for the weekly JACC Twitter chat and to tweet at regional conferences. Duffy said he would participate. She continues to work on plans to post instructional videos on JACC's website. Directors discussed the potential for making videos of conference sessions.

Deck said plans for the NorCal Conference at San Joaquin Delta College in Stockton were moving along.

Directors then discussed various logistical aspects of the regional conferences.

House said she would attend the Associated College Press (ACP) national convention in Louisville to discuss JACC and to compare notes on convention programming. She will be organizing programming for the March 28-30, 2019, State Convention in Sacramento. She also put in a pitch for the Midwinter Faculty Conference in Cambria. Rashidi said work to provide continuing-education credit for advisers was continuing.

McGrath reviewed plans for JACC expenditures and the potential for revenue from regional conferences.

Wirt said the JACC office was tracking invoices and payments and making deposits.

With no further business to discuss, House ended the meeting at 6:02 p.m.
